

We had not heard from him for quite some time and things seemed to be going fine in the parish where he had been assisting for about two years now. It was a good place to be after more than forty years of apostolate in his dear Philippines, and a good number of people were llocanos, and he had been in Ilocandia for such a long time ...

Andres was on the quiet road of Emmaus now. He had met the Lord there along the road on his way home, and he had recognized Him so often in the breaking of the bread, and people had recognized the Lord through him. He was a good priest, concerned about the people entrusted to his care, and to be with them made him happy. He loved to tell stories and people of all walks of life, the simple and the influential, enjoyed listening to him.

Ifugao and Kalinga-Apayao and Ilocandia: places where Andres had left his mark as a missionary on people, young and old. He could talk about them with enthusiasm; he seemed to have remained ever-young; his liveliness was contagious.

He has left us now, in a hurry as it were, to where the Lord had invited him, "to Galilee where they would see Him". Little had we suspected that the sadness and joy of the Holy Week would be reflected in Andres, so clearly and so soon. He has gone ahead of us, and yet he remains with us, in our memories, in our lives, in our faith.

May the Lord of the Resurrection walk with him now on the road to eternity, where faith and hope have vanished and where only love remains, there in the home of our eternal Father and of our Lord Jesus Christ and of the Spirit. So be it. Amen.
